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"I Have A Dream" Vs. "I Have A Drone"

The Press, under the direction of the powers that control the Obama White House continues to attempt to make comparisons between Obama and Dr. King. Additionally Obama's use of the King/Lincoln Symbology will be evident during his inauguration.

I think what we all need to keep in mind and what this show misses is that Dr. King was Christian minister first. He made that clear in many speeches and never departed from the basic premises of the Gospel of Christ. It's why some have called him a prophet and in the broadest sense, I think he was. He was a prophet whom God used to help redirect America's energies from the legacies of racial hared, poverty and militarism, towards something more enlightened and Godly. The American establishment did to him what they do to most prophets, they killed him... After Hoovers FBI persecuted him.

On another note, a Symposium on [a Vision For A New America](#) had its annual event yesterday, and it was pretty good. I listened to parts of it last night on my little mp3 player/fm radio. I know many Black folks don't like Tavis Smiley because he has not joined the "*lets turn off our brains, poke our eyes out and worship Obama*" club that permeates an increasingly impoverished and dysfunctional Black America. In short, he remembers the *real* Dr. King and what he stood for and is not going to let a mis-educated and misdirected Black America, stop him from reminding us how we really got where we are today and why so many of us are not moving forward but are rapidly falling behind in *every measurable category*.. This includes

Family life, abortion, income levels, employment rates, prison stats, child poverty... you name it - if there is a negative statistic, Black America usually is at or near the top of it. The trends have only *accelerated* under Obama.

Black, White, Latino, Native American, or even my rare Eskimo readers, take a little time and listen to this audio program, you may not agree with everything in it, but you will come away with a very different view of Barak Obama and what he really has stood for, stands for and continue to push over the next four years.

Brothers and sisters. I liked Dr. King because he was a Christian and abhorred violence, hate and injustice. Former Superior Court Judge [Lise Perlman wrote a book that deals with some of the issues behind the trial of Huey Newton](#) back in those tumultuous days and talks a bit on how it effected Gun Control. In fact according to some, it was indeed the Panthers pro-gun stance that began to put them on the political map and at one time. Believe it or not, the Black Panthers and the NRA were protesting *together*.

It is his ways that I hope Christians all over the world mimic. Yet just because I have dedicated my life to Christ and non-violence and exhort other men and women of God to do the same, does not give me the right to tell someone else that he should be that meek when someone comes to his neighborhood or house to do violence and mischief to his or her home and family. That I think is a decision that rests with every man and woman and their own conscience and it is the [height of hypocrisy to sign orders giving armed protection to you and yours](#) while moving slowly to take that right from someone else especially in light of the fact that many cities in America are so financially strapped that [they cannot afford to keep a viable police force](#).

Lest any man should boast. I think what God is saying here is that God wants us to look squarely in the mirror and look at what we really are and then acknowledge that we, who have made Christ our Lord and Savior (let none of us forget the 'Lord' part of this) are given salvation as a gift and no matter what struggles we endure for his name's sake, salvation is not dependent on us but on what Christ did for us on the cross. All the work was done by Christ on his cross. It is what is often referred to as the sufficiency of Christ.

If indeed a person has been saved, God's Holy Spirit dwells in that person and guides, teaches and admonishes him as we continue our walk with God. A person who just keeps on sinning or continually puts self first in their life after they claim to have been 'saved' almost certainly has not been born of God.*

For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live.
For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God. *For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father. The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God: And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together.*

God is leading us to greater righteousness, but lest any man should swell up with pride at his or her 'righteousness' God makes it clear that the work of Salvation was accomplished by Christ on his cross, whose name is blessed forever more. Don't swell up with Pride. Paul had to deal with that one and the Lord gave him a thorn in the flesh, lest his pride got the better of him (2Cor 12:7ff)
